Watch Your Mouth



Preparation Nugget: Words carry power with them. If you ever want to know what a person really thinks, listen to them talk. What you say with conviction will usually happen because conviction rises up from your spirit and is released through your words. Your faith can either side with God or against His Word. For example, I have a relative who always says “anything that can go wrong will go wrong for me. That’s just the way it is!” Guess what? That’s true. This person always has things go wrong. Listen to what you say and discover what you really believe to be true. If it doesn’t side with God’s perspective, change the way you speak or keep your mouth shut until you learn how to talk differently. Discipline yourself to study scriptures and meditate on how to apply them to your own life. As you do, your thinking will change and then, so will your words.

Meditation on the Word: *“But I say unto you, That every **idle** word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.” Matthew 12:37 KJV*

Nugget of Truth: What you believe and speak affects the natural world, including your finances. You have what you say. Learn to use your words wisely.

Most people are speaking words of fear and failure when it comes to their finances, especially during slow economic times. They say things like “the economy is so bad, nobody can afford to do anything that isn’t absolutely necessary”, “there are no jobs available anywhere”. I’m sure you get the idea. Don’t let words of doom and gloom rule your life. Put a guard over your words. Watch your mouth!

Fear activates Satan, but faith activates God. Watch your mouth!

It’s pretty frightening to think that we will be held accountable for every idle word we speak. Word in this scripture¹ means rhema. One of the definitions is: a series of words joined together into a sentence (a declaration of one's mind made in words). You see, when we speak with conviction we speak with authority. That’s one of the reasons it is so important to know God’s Word so we can side with it.

Words are powerful and full of creative power. When you agree with what God has said about you and speak His Word, your circumstances will begin to change and line up with His will for your life. Let’s look at how we would speak about finances during slow economic times when we are siding with God’s Word.

Prayer: “My God supplies all my needs according to HIS riches in glory; therefore I confess I have abundance. There is no lack. I have all sufficiency in all things. The WORD says I do. I thank you Father for it. Therefore I give it in faith, and Father, you will cause it to come to me in the Name of Jesus.”
